

Mrs. Strohfus 2nd Grade Newsletter - 9/15/10



Homework: At this age, learning at home happens in many different ways. One way your child learns at home is by completing and returning his/her <u>homework packet</u>, which is sent home in Thursday Folders. Equally important are <u>family activities</u>. For example, cooking helps your child apply what he/she knows about measurements, such as cups and quarts, and keeping a journal during a family trip helps your child get ideas for writing at school. These activities may seem routine and ordinary to us, but they are educational for children. Children can also <u>play games online</u> that help them practice skills they've learned at school. Please visit our classroom website for more information about websites with math and literacy games that your child can play on your home computer or on a computer at your local library.

<u>Math</u>: We are reviewing number sequences (1-100) and finding patterns on our number grid (counting by 2s, 5s, and 10s). We are also finding the values of coins and bills.

<u>Writing</u>: We are working on "showing" not "telling" in our writing. We are using proper nouns (or names that are capitalized) instead of common nouns, such as the girl. "Power Flowers" have helped us to add vivid verbs to our writing. We brainstormed more vivid verbs for "eats" and came up with: devours, nibbles, munches, crunches, slurps. Ask your child to describe how he/she is eating at home.

<u>Reading</u>: We have been learning more about story elements in reading. We are practicing retelling our stories with a beginning, middle, and an end. Practice this with your child at home after you've read a story together. We have talked about elements such as, characters, setting, and plot. During Reading Group Time, your child is reading independently for 20-30 minutes each day. The books he/she is reading are leveled using a computer program called Accelerated Reader (AR). After your child completes a book, he/she takes a computer-based quiz on the book.

<u>Science</u>: This week, we started talking about how seeds become plants. We turned a clear plastic glove into a "greenhouse" to grow bean plants that will help us explore the needs of plants.
